I am proud to say that we have continued on our path of excellence here at Dunbar High School. In the last newsletter, I mentioned that we had two national champions who would be competing in the Microsoft World Championships. I am proud to say that Andrew Chuang Saladin is a Microsoft World Champion and Carson Mulvey is a Microsoft World Runner-up. What makes this even more remarkable is that Andrew and Carson were the only competitors from the United States who placed in the top 10!

We have also continued to excel in our various activities. Our CyberPatriots team captured first place in the state, and our JROTC teams placed 5th at the state JROTC Raider competition. Our football team completed its first undefeated football season since the school's reopening. We are also proud to say that we had our largest number of swim team members ever qualify for the state championships, while our cross country team finished 15th in the state. I must also mention that our Dunbar Tiger Marching Band received the honor of being invited to the Peach Bowl in Atlanta and performed there in late December.

Additionally, we are in the midst of showing the community the successful opportunities Dunbar High School provides. We held three nights of Zoom meetings from November 16th through the 18th, in both English and Spanish, to showcase our IB/STEM programs. We held our in-person IB/STEM information night on December 9th and will hold our Tiger Showcase, which is a schoolwide presentation, on January 18. We are also visiting various middle schools to present to future Tigers. Additionally, SAC receives funds "to be used at the discretion of the School Advisory Committee [whereas] a portion of the money should be used for implementing the school improvement plan." Furthermore, "the improvement plan shall include performance indicators which are measurable."



All IB students should have returned their Academic Honesty Policy to their English/TOK/PPS teacher signed by both themselves and their parent/guardian. It is important for students to understand their responsibility in their academic writing and research. Additionally, we will continue to monitor students' grade point averages to ensure success in the program. Students needing support are encouraged to attend IB tutoring and study hall on Wednesdays until 4:00 PM in the Media Center. Transportation is available.

Our senior DP students have completed their Extended Essay, one of the CORE components of their program. The Extended Essay is a maximum of 4,000 words research paper on a topic of their choice. The students have been working on this task for the last year. This is a big step in completing the IBDP program. The senior CP students have also completed their Reflective Projects, which are a maximum of 3,000 words on an ethical dilemma related to their chosen career path. DP and CP students should be finishing their CAS/Service Learning projects, including documentation in ManageBac. For our senior IB students, the completion of these major components of the program signals that they are nearing the end of their coursework and will soon be reviewing for External Assessments in May.


Our Junior DP and CP students are just beginning the process of choosing topics and titles for their writing/research assignments and learning about CAS and Service Learning. They are also starting to research and build knowledge in each of their IB classes to prepare for Internal Assessments that will be given throughout the following year and a half.

In December, we held our annual IB Pinning and Awarding of Certificates and Diplomas. At this event, the alumni from 2021 returned to receive their awards, and the class of 2022 received their IB pins. It is always wonderful to have our alumni back and to hear about their successes post-high school graduation!

Furthermore, one of our students has created a great graphic for new IB shirts. Shirts will be for sale in the following months.

Finally, IB applications for incoming freshmen are due to Gayle Baisch (GayleLB@leeschools.net) January 28. Acceptance/Denial letters will be mailed February 11, and student intent letters are due to schools February 23. Please visit our website for IB applications and other information about our programs.
