Our JROTC program recently earned various awards at the County Drill Competition with the female team capturing second and qualifying for the State Drill Competition.

Among our many advanced technology programs, I can truly say the skills that students are learning in the cybersecurity courses are above and beyond the computer courses you see at other high schools. The Dunbar CyberPatriot team recently captured 3rd place in Florida. We also continue to excel in the Microsoft Championships by competing in a new season, as we now have our 25th Certiport Microsoft Office Specialist Florida State Champion: both Isabel Liu and Carson Mulvey earned 1st place in Florida and have qualified for the 2022 Microsoft Office National Championship! Additionally, our Technology Student Association (TSA) finished 5th in the state at the 2022 Florida conference in Orlando. They are headed to Nationals in Dallas, Texas!

Furthermore, our Math Team is currently ranked 2nd in Region 4 of Florida, which encompasses high schools from Tampa to Naples, trailing fellow national powerhouse Tampa King High School. We are proud of our Math Team students, as they continue to be recognized as one of the top Math Teams in the nation.

Over the next few weeks, we will be adding 8th grade students for the 2022-23 school year, while our current seniors are in the process of completing their legacies as Dunbar Tigers. That includes putting the finishing touches on their academic coursework; preparing for IB and AP testing; acquiring more industry certifications; and making decisions about their post high school plans including college, career, and military. I am very proud of the work put forth by both students and staff to what has been a very successful year thus far. I continue to look forward to the achievements that will occur here at Dunbar, where "Achievement is the Expectation!"


